A SHOP I ENJOY is Mixta (mixtasanmiguel .com), which shares a patio with our office. The Australian owner, Anna Sinclair, has a great eye and brings back from all her trips cool and eclectic clothing, objects, fabrics, furniture and more. I have bought many of her things, ranging from enamel tequila cups to a favorite beaded T-shirt.

KINGSLEY MARKET is a great addition to San Miguel for its leather goods. Lisa Kingsley's bags are all made in Mexico and have become cult favorites.

FOR TRADITIONAL MEXICAN FOOD, we go to **Rincón de Don Tomás**, which is right on El Jardín. Try the *arrachera*, a tender grilled meat with *chilaquiles* and beans. The children finish their quesadillas and then run around in the square while we keep an eye on them.

on saturday, when I want to hang out with the cool crowd (most restaurants in San Miguel have a special night of the week when locals show up), I go to La Azotea for the small plates and good choice of wines and music. Perched on a rooftop, it has a great view of the town.

ON SUNDAY OR MONDAY we go to La Mezcalería (facebook.com/lamezcalería SMA) for food that's simple but excellent. It is small and can get loud, so we always go early. My favorite of the margaritas is the mezcal de chile guero.

ON WEDNESDAY it's La Sirena Gorda, cantina-like with saloon-style swinging doors and a very laid-back vibe. I order seafood: pescado al pastor and tostada de atún or carpaccio de pulpo. And I drink the ginger lemonade.

ON THURSDAY we go to The Restaurant (therestaurantsanmiguel.com) for Burger Night. The stunning courtyard is one of many in town, and the fare is quite elegant, including the mousseline of asparagus. But what I really like is the veggie burger. The owner is a great local character, with a knife tattoo on his arm. >>
